Things to consider:

Reading Logs – use comment forms, drop down menus

Video Responses – use comment forms, drop down menus

*Make these public responses or emailed to you.

Change email address to suit you. You may consider creating an alternate email so that it doesn't fill up your work inbox each time there is a reply.

Student Artwork – take a picture or scan art and post as a picture to display student achievement in art and provide families with a 'window into the classroom'

Consider adding audio and video of yourself teaching lessons or reading poems. Students can then respond using a comment form.

Parent Section – include useful dates, upload files as PDF, class calendar, recommended book reading (from you!) , parent survey (is this blog useful, etc.)

Video, video, video – engage your students with fun and interesting videos that will ignite their curiosity. Be sure to include a comment form for their reaction, etc.

Remembrance Day is coming up. Be sure to include a video or something meaningful that the children can watch, read, and respond to. Major holidays and school events provide meaningful opportunities to engage students through the blog.
